ROGER COLLET: Energy Resource and Development

Roger has been with the Department Energy and Resource Development since 1999 and worked in the Fredericton District Office from 2002-2014. During this time he worked on many fires here in New Brunswick and was mobilized 5 times to help other Provinces battle forest fires. Since 2015 Roger has been working at the Provincial Fire Center as the Provincial Wildfire Prevention Officer. He is a member of NBAFPO Board.

MILT CAWLEY: Retired Deputy Chief of the Riverview Fire Department

Milt had 45 years service in the Fire Service prior to his retirement. He spent 29 years with the Military Fire Service, retiring in 1997 as Fire Chief in Greenwood Nova Scotia. In September of 1997 he joined the Riverview Fire and Rescue.

Milt is an internationally certified Fire Fighter and Fire Officer in accordance with the International Fire Service Accreditation Congress, Oklahoma State University. He attained the IFSAC accreditations in the following fields:

- Levels 1, 2, 3 and 4 Fire Service Instructor (NFPA 1041)
- Level 1 Public Fire Educator (NFPA 1035)
- Levels 1,2, 3 Fire Fighter (NFPA 1001)
- Levels 1,2,3 Fire Officer (NFPA 1021)
- Airport Firefighter (NFPA 1003)
- Fire Inspector Levels 1,2,3 (NFPA 1031)
- Fire Apparatus Driver Operator (NFPA 1002)
- Level 1 Fire Investigator (NFPA 1033).

As well, Milt has advanced courses through the Canadian Fire Investigation School: Level II Fire Investigation and Level III Advanced Fire Investigation

BRIAN McBAIN: Senior Regulatory Affairs Representative Codes and Advisory Services with the Underwriters Laboratories of Canada Inc.

Brian has over 24 years of experience in fire and emergency services and has worked in all aspects of fire and life safety. He presently works for Underwriters Laboratories of Canada (ULC) as a Senior Regulatory Affairs Representative where he provides assistance to regulatory authorities across Canada with regards to ULC certification and ULC Standards. Brian has worked at ULC for 13 years. Brian also served three years at the Ontario Office of the Fire Marshal and Emergency Management (OFMEM) as a Fire Protection Specialist, worked nine years in the Fire Protection industry and currently has 24 years of service as a volunteer Firefighter and Fire Prevention Officer.

Brian has been a RCMP member for 15 years. He began his career with the Montreal Drug Section and worked 3 years on the full time Clan Lab Team. That's where he gained most of his experience with clan labs. In 2014 Kevin became the J Division Clan Lab Team Coordinator. He spearheading the RCMP's fentanyl response in NB and he is an instructor at the Canadian Police College.

LAURA KING: Public Education Representative for the NFPA

Prior to taking the position with NFPA in September 2017, Laura was editor of the *Fire Fighting in Canada* and *Canadian Firefighter* magazines for ten years. She was a journalist for more than 30 years.

Laura is well known to the fire service in Canada. As an editor and writer, not only at Fire Fighting in Canada, but at a number of daily newspapers, she has covered fire service issues in the provinces and territories and has built a strong network of contacts.

Laura is a former Canadian correspondent for *The Deal*, a business newspaper in New York, and was for many years a regular columnist for a U.S. legal magazine, *The American Lawyer*.

Laura has an honours degree in journalism, political science and public administration from Carleton University, and a certificate in Introduction to Incident Management Systems; she is a certified Road to Mental Readiness instructor, and is NFPA 1035 certified as a fire-and-life-safety officer.
