FIRE PREVENTION WEEK OCT. 4-10, 2015

Theme: Hear The Beep Where You Sleep. Every Bedroom Needs a Working Smoke Alarm!

The **key message** of this year's Fire Prevention Week campaign is to install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of your home, including the basement.

Did you know that roughly half of home fire deaths result from fires reported between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m., when most people are asleep? If there is a fire in your home, smoke spreads fast and you need smoke alarms to give you time to get out. In fact, having a working smoke alarm cuts the chances of dying in a reported fire in half!

It is also important that your family has, and practice Escape Plan.



DNR

DNR had a busy spring. There were a total of 167 fires with 192 hectares affected. The largest fire was 20 hectares with the most excitement being in the Bonny River area in southern NB. There were close to 60 fires in that area.
